#### SHARING SUNDAY'S GOSPEL



This coming Sunday the Church celebrates Pentecost. This is the feast of the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church. In this Sunday's Gospel, the risen Jesus offers his disciples the Holy Spirit and inner peace. True peace (the removal of all anxiety, worry and envy) comes only from God. God's peace is not dependent on peaceful conditions: we can experience it even in the midst of turmoil and uncertainty. St Margaret Mary Alacoque reminds us, "Peace of heart is more valuable than any treasure." Even if you may sometimes doubt, or feel distant from God, be assured that God is very close to you and wanting you to be filled with his peace. Enjoy a very special time together this evening, hearing your child's thoughts about this Sunday's Gospel and this Wednesday's word, which is PEACE.

Year 4


This week in Maths, the children of Year 4 have been exploring number sequences and patterns.

Little Princess Trust is a charity that provides real hair wigs, free of charge, to children and young people who have lost their own hair through cancer treatment ...


Amelia has also raised £900 which is nearly enough for two wigs to be made, each wig costs £550 each.

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# English Pupil Voice

At St. Paulinus, children from Early Years to Year 6 thoroughly enjoy English and Reading in particular. When asked what grade they would give to Reading, they scored a resounding average of 9.4! They like all parts of the lesson: from the prediction to the comprehension: 'I like doing 'wordle', because I can see the importance of different words and it helps me with predicting what the story will be about. I can use my creativity'.

Children commented that 'Reading takes your mind off things, it is good, I can escape to a different world'. 'I like learning about new things, new words - and I like it when my teacher tells me I can use up-levelled words'.

When asked about writing, children were equally as enthusiastic! 'I like writing because I can invent a story and my favourite part is when we can create our own stories.' 'I really like the story of Beowulf as it is gruesome and I like stories with monsters.'

Writing is more difficult but I like using the Alan Peat sentences as it makes my writing better.'
