SHARING GOD's GOSPEL

Regular Attendance

Kirklees Council will issue penalty notices or it may lead to fast track prosecution at the magistrate's court, if you are convicted, you could be fined up to £1000 and you will get a criminal record, this is regardless of your child's attendance percentage.

Year 3


We have started a new P.E. topic; Yoga. The children learnt some relaxation methods as well as some stretches to help our bodies and mind.
