Year 5 - Summer Term Curriculum Letter

We hope that you are looking forward to lots of exciting learning over the course of the summer term.

In R.E. the themes of learning are 'Life in the Risen Jesus' and 'The Transforming Spirit'. Within 'Life in the Risen Jesus', we will look at the meaning of the Resurrection, its importance and what it means for us today. We will also explore the importance of Pentecost and how it was the 'beginning of the Church'. We will explore the ways that Jesus' spirit is present with us and how we can be present with him through prayer. In 'The Transforming Spirit' we will look at the Ascension and how it affected the disciples. We will focus on the apostles and how the Holy Spirit transformed them, including how the Spirit transformed Peter and how he was the first Pope. Parents are encouraged to start discussions with children relating to these topics focusing on key terminology and its meaning.

In Mathematics - we will be focussing on fluency, reasoning and problem-solving skills involving whole numbers and decimals (further information can be found on the Maths plan). To help your children you need to provide them with opportunities to practise their times tables, recap on previous topics to keep it fresh and encourage problem solving relating to real life issues, such as using money and measure as an example. You can help your child by encouraging them to use mental maths skills whenever possible.

In **English** we will be looking at the poem 'Beowulf' through an adaptation written by Michael Morpugo; a tale that has been told over a thousand years and is a classic that children, will love and engage with. This will allow us to develop our writing through recounts from various chapters in the novel. We will show our empathy with the characters through writing diary entries. We will also write character descriptions, as well as writing an invitation to a feast at the mead-hall.

In Science we will be learning about the planets in our solar system, describing the movement of the Earth, Moon and Sun and explaining day and night. In the second half of the term we will be investigating Forces such as gravity and investigating how objects fall. At home children could be doing some of their own topic research to help them further engage with the topic.

Our History theme this half term is 'The Vikings'. Following on from our learning of the Anglo-Saxons in the Autumn term, we will find out how Britain developed during / after the Vikings invaded. We will find out where the Vikings came from and how and why they raided Britain. We will find out how they lived and how their legal system worked.

Next half term in Geography we will be studying 'the Globe". We will learn the meaning of different geographical terms such as longitude and latitude: compare different hemispheres; investigate time difference and locate some of the world's deserts.

In **RPSHE** we will be discussing a variety of topics including: Careers; aspirations; role models; the future. The children will explore a variety of different job roles and what qualifications they may need to achieve them. Alongside this we will be focusing on growing and changing.

Physical Education (P.E.) – is on Tuesdays and Fridays for both classes.

Children will continue to come to school wearing their P.E. kits on these days. Please may we take this opportunity to kindly remind all families that the school P.E. kit is uniform and that pupils should <u>not</u> come to school in clothes that do not form the school P.E. kit.

- The St. Paulinus P.E. kit consists of:
 - o a plain white t-shirt with or without the school logo (no brands or patterns).
 - o plain black or dark grey shorts / jogging bottoms or leggings (no brands or patterns),
 - o grev school hoodie with the school logo.
 - o Trainers or a pair of pumps.
- In addition, the **only** jewellery permitted in school is a pair of plain small stud earrings. If your child has pierced ears, these need to be removed on each morning of P.E. for health and safety reasons.

Please note that staff are not able to remove earrings, so this will result in your child not taking part in our P.E. lesson and an alternative task will be provided for the child, this is due to health and safety reasons.

- Long hair <u>must</u> be tied back.
- All P.E. kit (including school uniform) must be labelled clearly with your child's name. If it becomes lost, it can then be easily returned to the rightful owner.
- Please ensure your child wears their PE kit on their P.E. days.

<u>Homework</u> - This will be handed out on a **Friday** and MUST be completed and returned to school by the following **Wednesday**.

<u>Reading</u> - Children will have an independent reading book which will be brought home on a daily basis and MUST be returned to school every day. Please remember to write in your child's reading record to acknowledge that you have listened to your child read. It is also very important to check your child understands when reading. Finally, please remember to access Bug Club.

As you know we try very hard to keep parents regularly informed about what's going on at our school, however sending paper letters home can be rather 'hit and miss' with letters often going astray along the way.

Year 5: Vikings

Summer Term Curriculum Overview

'Beowulf' by Michael Morpurgo



English – As writers and communicators we will:

- Write a character profile.
- Write an invitation to a feast.
- Write a job advertisement / wanted posters.
- Letter writing Beowulf to home.
- Recount of the feast in mead-hall.
- Explanation text writing how to kill a monster.
- To create a map from detail in text place.

Mathematics - As mathematicians we will be:

- Converting units of measure.
- Calculating with whole numbers and decimals.
- 2-D and 3-D shape.
- Estimate and calculating volume.
 - Problem solving.

Geography: The Globe. We will:

- Identify the equator, the tropics of cancer and Capricorn and the Greenwich meridian.
- Identify the position and significance of latitude and longitude, the Equator, Northern and Southern Hemispheres, the tropics of cancer and Capricorn, Arctic and Antarctic Circle, the prime/Greenwich meridian.
- Begin to identify the position of time zones (including night and day).
- To know the names of and locate some of the world's deserts and describe what that environment is like.

RPSHE - As we are continuing to develop we will:

- Learn about the importance of mobile phone safety.
- Learn about how we will grow and change.
- Learn about what jobs we will like.

Erench - As linguists we will be learning about 'le retour du printemps' meaning the return of spring and finishing the year with 'les planètes' meaning the planets.

History — As historians we will study the struggle between the Vikings and Anglo-Saxons for the Kingdom of England learning, specifically about:

- Where the Vikings originated from and show this on a map.
- The importance of travel and how this developed the civilisation / us today?
- That the Vikings and Anglo-Saxons were often in conflict.
- Why the Vikings frequently won battles against the Anglo-Saxons.

Links will also be made with English (carrying out research), Design Technology (designing/making a longboat, design and make a Viking style meal).

Design Technology – As designers we will be investigating and create a game. We will:

- Carry out research into user needs and existing products, using surveys, interviews, questionnaires and web-based resources.
- Understand how to build a circuit structure for our fully functioning working buzz game.

Science – We will be learning about the planets in our Solar System and forces. We will:

- Be using Mathematics to model the dimensions of our solar system.
- Be describing the movement of the earth and moon relative to the sun in our solar system.
- Be identifying evidence that has been used to support a theory.
- Be describing the movement of the moon relative to the earth.

Be using simple models to explain scientific areas,

Be explaining some of the effect of gravity.

such as day and night.

- Be planning, carrying out and explaining a fair test to find out how well different objects fall.
- Be observing a variety of forces that slow things down.

Art - As artists we will:

- Share ideas about painting techniques and paint materials
 Discuss our work and produce work in response to well-known artists.
- Organise and combine visual and tactile qualities of materials and develop explorations, ideas and responses in our work.
- Compare and comment on ideas, methods and approaches in our own and others' work.

Music This term our music is focused around 'Dancing In The Street' by Martha And The Vandellas as well as consolidating everything we have learnt this year.

P.E. - As athletes we will:

- Play net and field games.
- Carry out athletics to prepare for our sports day.
- Improve our swimming technique and water confidence.

Computing - We will:

- Creating games as Game creators.
- 3D modelling.
- Investigating concept maps.

R.E. - As theologians we will :

- Understand that Jesus is risen from the dead.
- Learn that Jesus is present among us different ways.

- Learn that there are different ways of praying.
- Reflect on Jesus' teaching and example on prayer.
 - Learn how to pray the Rosary.

The Transforming Spirit:

- Know about the Ascension.
- Understand what happened at Pentecost.
 Understand how the Holy Spirit worked through the Apostles.
- Understand that the popes are successors of St. Peter.
