

Year 6 Pol Ed Promotional Film

As you know, St Paulinus has been using the Pol.Ed scheme for a number of years now to supplement their RPSHE curriculum. Pol-Ed is a West Yorkshire Police education programme, written by teachers for teachers in schools across West Yorkshire. Its purpose is to keep children safe by developing their understanding of risks, consequences, and the law and to develop their resilience and ability to help and support each other. In fact, St. Paulinus took part in the initial pilot and was one of the first schools in the country to introduce this scheme.

With the success we had in school with Pol.Ed, two years ago, West Yorkshire Police asked us to be part of its first promotional video and we gladly accepted with a full day of filming taking place in the summer of 2022 by Pocket Projects, an award-winning creative film company who make documentaries, short films, promotional videos and arts films. The original film was so well received that when West Yorkshire Police introduced their new, updated Pol.Ed programme this academic year and decided they needed to film another promotional video, they once again thought of St Paulinus. The children really enjoyed the experience of filming and at the end, Pol.Ed team commented on their impeccable behaviour and patience during the whole process – well done Year 6!



Year 6 Vaping Workshops

Yesterday, Laura Dixon (Kirklees Education & Prevention Coordinator) delivered a workshop to both our Year 6 classes on Vaping, Cigarettes and alternative tobacco products. The session covered three main questions 'What is vaping?', 'what is nicotine?' and 'what are other ways nicotine can be used?'

Within those questions the children looked at the law, why vaping exists, some reasons why people take up vaping, negative effects in the short term, signs of addiction, exploitation and pressure to try.

Our Year 6 children listened carefully and understood the importance of learning about the health facts of vaping and the law (e.g. In the UK, it is against the law to sell nicotine vaping products to under-18s or for adults to buy them on their behalf) so they can make an informed choice in the future.
